What Is PROMISE?

- Program to improve the education and career outcomes of low income children with disabilities receiving SSI
 - advances goal of fostering interagency collaboration at the Federal and State levels to improve services and drive innovation
- \$32.5 million grant for 5 year demonstration





The Problem

A significant number of child SSI recipients do not become independent, self-sufficient tax paying members of the community.

Parents and families of many SSI recipients are not self-sufficient & face many problems:

- Low educational attainment and employment rates**
- Low postsecondary and/or vocational rehabilitation enrollment rates**





Overview

- **\$36 M over 5 years from ED**
 - DWD-DVR lead agency
 - Target SSI youth between 14-16
 - Must enroll 2000 before April 30, 2016
- **Outcomes include:**
 - Employment
 - Educational attainment
 - Family Income
- **Work with youth and family!**




Cases With Family Service Plan (FSP)





Family Training Advocates

- Supplement to original grant
- Meeting Parents where they are
- Individualized services
- Advocate/mentor/navigator
- Based on work with Shannon Huff and Barbara Katz
- \$3.5 M over the remaining portion of grant



Return on Investment

Avg monthly SSI payment = \$721

Yearly amount = \$8652

Working to Age 21- 65 = \$380,688
