

COORDINATION WITH STATEWIDE INDEPENDENT LIVING COUNCIL AND INDEPENDENT LIVING CENTERS

The State Plan for Independent Living (SPIL) is a plan developed by the Independent Living Council of Wisconsin (ILCW) and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) in cooperation with other partners. The SPIL ensures the existence of appropriate planning, financial support and coordination, and other assistance to appropriately address, on a statewide and comprehensive basis, the needs in the State for:

- A. The provision of State independent living services;
- B. The development and support of a statewide network of centers for independent living; and
- C. Working relationships between programs providing independent living services and independent living centers, the vocational rehabilitation program established under Title I, and other programs providing services for individuals with disabilities.

It addresses use of funds and coordination of activities for the federal "State Independent Living Services" (SILS) and Centers for Independent Living (CIL) programs. The Wisconsin SPIL is effective for FFY 2008 through FFY 2010. During FFY 2010, the DVR Administrator remains the DSU representative to the ILCW.
