Job Center Web Site Registration Changes Take Effect July 30

Registration guarantees continuous access to online job postings, other resources 365 days a year

MADISON – As part of ongoing efforts to target individualized service to job seekers and gather accurate and complete data about user activity, www.JobCenterofWisconsin.com (JCW) will require job seekers and other general users to register starting Monday, July 30th.

The registration process, available via a confidential, secure web platform that safeguards personal information, will enhance the ability of the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) to provide targeted services such as job matching to customers. It will also ensure that Wisconsin is providing accurate user counts to the U.S. Department of Labor via required federal reports. Once registered, users will be able to access job postings and other features under a secure log-on system.

A new feature, “My JCW,” will allow users to track their status and manage their JCW services. DWD will continue to enhance this feature in the coming months, to ensure a better and more successful user experience.

Since the free, 24-hour site went live in 2008, employers have been required to register in order to post job openings. In addition, job seekers have been required to register in order to utilize resume functionality.

Effective July 30, visitors to www.JobCenterofWisconsin.com will need to be registered in order to obtain full JCW functionality, including any job searches, resume creation, job matching functionality and other services. General career information, links and other resources will remain accessible to non-registered users.

Both DWD’s [agency web site](#) and www.JobCenterofWisconsin.com have been updated to alert visitors to the new requirement. In addition, www.JobCenterofWisconsin.com has a list of [frequently asked questions](#) about the new requirement, as well as detailed, [step-by-step instructions for general audiences](#) that can be downloaded or printed.

Additional instructions also are provided for specific populations including [Unemployment Insurance \(UI\) claimants](#) and those in [Re-Employment Services \(RES\)](#) programs.
