Applicants MUST:

Be Citizens or permanent residents; Meet requirements of one of nine target groups listed below.

DEFINITIONS OF ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS:

Applicants Must NOT:

Have prior employment with the same employer; Be related by blood or marriage to the principal owner;

Be a replacement during a labor dispute

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION:

Listed below are **examples** of acceptable documentation. Additional items may be included.

Note: <u>If</u> employer provided with a signed Conditional Certification (9062) from a <u>qualified agency</u> - no documentation is required

- Has a Ticket-to-Work AND an Employment Network Plan
