

DESCRIPTION AND GOALS OF COURSE

The Academy of Beauty Professionals offers the student a planned curriculum of theory, practical, and clinical experiences, organized in a progressive sequence, which is intended to prepare the graduate for entry into the barbering profession.

The following are objectives that the student will learn during the 1000 hour barbering training period at the Academy of Beauty Professionals.

- Hygiene, grooming, and personal development.
- Bacteriology, sterilization, and sanitation.
- Tools, equipment, and implements.
- Haircutting, hair tapering (clipper cuts), razor cutting, hair styling, curling, thermal waving, finger waving, roller-setting, pin curl placement, blow-drying, shampoos, scalp and hair treatments, conditioning, reconditioning, hair analysis, and care of hairpieces, wigs, and wefts.
- Hair straightening, hair relaxing, thermal hair straightening, blow-outs, permanents, hair coloring, tinting, bleach and chemistry.
- Shaving, beard and mustache trimming, basic principles of electricity, facials, facial massage.
- Anatomy and physiology of the hair and skin, and disorders of the hair, skin, and scalp.
- Interview, resume, job skills, and professionalism.
- Product knowledge, product use and sales, preparing and consulting with customers.
- Laws, rules, professional ethics, and history of Barbering.
- Individual student needs, industry trends and electives, such as recordkeeping, mathematics, communications, human relations, public relations, social responsibility, wellness, and first aid.

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS

The instructor will guide the learning process by the implementation of appropriate methods of teaching. These will include demonstration, lecture, audiovisual aids, and mannequin and clinic practice.

GRADING PROCEDURES

Student's achievements are evaluated by means of written and practical examinations. The written tests require the student to demonstrate competency in the theory, principles, and practice of barbering by responding to questions related to the subject. Practical exams are based on pre-determined specific criteria. To maintain satisfactory academic progress the average of theory and practical exams must be at least 80%.

The following topics and related materials will be taught during the Barbering training period at the Academy of Beauty Professionals under Course of Instruction, State of Wisconsin Barbering Examining Board, B0.300-1 Practitioner License Syllabus.

Orientation is 1-1.5 hours long. The students do receive clock hours for this period of time, included as individual needs, under the WI syllabus.
