

DESCRIPTION AND GOALS OF COURSE

The Academy of Beauty Professionals offers the student a planned curriculum of theory, practical, and clinical experiences, organized in a progressive sequence, which is intended to prepare the graduate for entry into the profession of a Nail Technician. The following are objectives that the student will learn during the 300-hour Nail Technology training period at the Academy of Beauty Professionals.

- Introduction, law and codes, bookkeeping, business management, history, and ethics.
- Safety, sanitation, sterilization, first aid, and bacteriology.
- · Nail and skin disorders.
- Manicuring, pedicuring, and nail enhancement.
- Interview, resume, job skills, and professionalism.
- Introduction to advertising.
- Individual student needs and electives including that, but not limited to, structured visits conducted by the school outside of the classroom at one or more cosmetology or manicuring establishments.

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS

The instructor will guide the learning process by the implementation of appropriate methods of teaching. These will include demonstration, lecture, audiovisual aids, and clinic practice.

GRADING PROCEDURES

Student's achievements are evaluated by means of written and practical examinations. The written tests require the student to demonstrate competency in the theory, principles, and practice of esthetics by responding to questions related to the subject. Practical exams are based on pre-determined specific criteria. To maintain satisfactory academic progress the average of theory and practical exams must be at least 80%.

The following topics and related materials will be taught during the Manicurist Course training period at the Academy of Beauty Professionals under Course of Instruction, State of Wisconsin Cos 5.06 Practitioner License Syllabus.

Orientation is 1-1.5 hours long. The students do receive clock hours for this period of time, included as individual needs, under the WI syllabus.
