PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Paralegals work in many areas of the law under the supervision of attorneys. They perform a wide variety of legal tasks, such as interviewing clients and witnesses, drafting legal pleadings and memoranda, assisting in pretrial and trial preparation and proceedings, performing legal research, preparing various legal documents, and analyzing complex transactions and procedures.

The paralegal studies certificate will empower and equip students with the knowledge and skills fundamental to the paralegal profession in both the private and public sectors. This program also adds value to students entering a variety of other professional disciplines.

The program emphasizes ethics, critical thinking, legal research, legal writing and verbal communication, strategic problem-solving, and other applied skills necessary for navigating today's legal environment.

Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended. *Note: Applicants must have completed a bachelor's degree or 60 college credits to be eligible for this certificate.*
