ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All students applying for admission to the program must have:

- Bachelor's degree or higher from a regionally accredited college or university
- Overall GPA of 2.75 or higher
- B or higher in the following courses: Anatomy and Physiology I; Anatomy and Physiology II; Chemistry; Microbiology
- C or higher in College Algebra
- Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) course completion

And must submit:

- Current CV or resume that includes educational and professional experience
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions
- Two letters of recommendation
- A personal essay addressing the following points; this should be an example of your best writing and should not exceed 350 words per discussion point
 - Describe why you are choosing a career in nursing.
 - Concordia University is Christ-centered, valuing truth and integrity, excellence, and service. How does this fit with your values and beliefs?
 - In reflection on your qualifications as a candidate for our program, describe how you will manage your time and financial responsibilities to be successful in an accelerated nursing program.
