



**RE:** Corrected Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Program Year 2019 Allotments

**PURPOSE:** To transmit the allotments of Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title I Funds to the Wisconsin Workforce Development Boards (WDBs) for Program Year 2019 (PY19) and State Fiscal Year 2020 (SFY20).

**BACKGROUND:** The United States Department of Labor (DOL), Employment and Training Administration published the Guidance Letter (TEGL) No. 16-18, with the details of the allotments for WIOA, Wagner Peyser and the Workforce Information Grant. Wisconsin received a PY19 formula allotment totaling \$42,321,274. This is a 5.71 percent decrease from PY18. Changes by program are detailed in the chart below.

Funding for Adult and Dislocated Workers will be issued using the same process as last year, Quarter 1 will be issued July 1, 2019, and Quarters 2-4 will be issued October 1, 2019 as a grant modification. It is anticipated that funds will be distributed to states by allotment through Notices of Awards (NOA) on or by these two dates. The Youth allocation will be allocated

annually upon receipt of the Youth NOA from DOL. TEGL 16-18 prohibits funds available through the “advance” allocation (October 1, 2019) to be used for activity prior to the award date. Therefore, the amounts available for use at the Workforce Development Area (WDA) level in PY19 are:

The State of Wisconsin, Department of Workforce Development (DWD), Division of Employment and Training is distributing eighty-five percent (85%) of the Youth (\$8,577,938), eighty-five percent (85%) of Quarter 1 Adult (\$1,172,798), and sixty percent (60%) of Quarter 1 Dislocated Worker (\$1,194,649) allotments authorized by DOL to WDBs as shown in the spreadsheet attached (Attachment A) to this memo. Eighty-five percent (85%) of Quarter 2-4 Adult (\$6,234,132) and sixty percent (60%) of Quarter 2-4 Dislocated Worker (\$5,664,121) will be distributed by DWD for use after October 1, 2019, contingent upon availability of funds and federal guidelines and regulations. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the Dislocated Worker allotment (\$2,857,822; Q1=\$497,771, Q2-4=\$2,360,051) has been set aside for the Rapid Response program. DWD retains the fifteen percent (15%) of the funds for state level program administration and oversight, (\$4,535,553).

PY19 WIOA Dislocated Worker allocations have been based on the most recent Farm Loss Data (2017).

Allocations for each WDA for Quarter 1 (Youth reflects an annual allocation) are provided in Attachment A, “Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Allocations by WDA: PY19 – Quarter 1.” Attachment B provides preliminary allocations for each WDA after October 1, 2019. Contracts with individual WDAs will be modified at that time to reflect actual allocations for the period after October 1, 2019. WDA allocations are calculated by multiplying the local portion of the state allotment by the WDA’s allocation share. Allocation shares are calculated in accordance with the process described in the current approved state plan.
