



WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

2013 Senate Bill 395

2013 Senate Bill 395 changes the required number of training hours for a cosmetologist license from 1,800 to 1,550. The bill also exempts the following services from the cosmetology license requirement:

- A service performed preparatory to a live public performance or appearance, whether in person or through broadcast media.
- A service performed in the course of the production of any digital, analog, or other recording of a moving or still image intended for public release or broadcast.

Senate Amendment 1

Senate Amendment 1 was offered by Senator Harsdorf. The amendment allows someone who has been educated at an out-of-state cosmetology school to have that education be recognized for Wisconsin licensure, provided that the schools were accredited by an agency approved by the Department of Safety and Professional Services, which must promulgate rules to identify these agencies.

Bill History

On December 19, 2013, the Senate Committee on Health and Human Services recommended adoption of Senate Amendments 1 and 2 on votes of Ayes, 5; and Noes, 0; and recommended passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 5; and Noes, 0.

November 11, 2013 - Introduced by Senators HARSDORF, L. TAYLOR, GROTHMAN and TIFFANY, cosponsored by Representatives KNUDSON, KOOYENGA, KRUG, MURPHY, TITTL, OHNSTAD, KNODL and MURTHA. Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 440.62 (3) (ar) 2., 454.02 (3) (b) and 454.06 (2) (b); and **to create**
2 454.02 (3) (bm) and 454.21 (3) of the statutes; **relating to:** cosmetologist
3 training hours and exemption of makeup artists from barbering and
4 cosmetology licensure requirements.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, an applicant for a cosmetologist license must complete at least 1,800 training hours in a course of instruction in cosmetology. This bill changes the required number of training hours to 1,550.

Also under current law, a person must be licensed in order to perform barbering, cosmetology, aesthetics, or manicuring for compensation in this state. This bill exempts the following services from those licensure requirements:

1. A service performed preparatory to a live public performance or appearance, whether in-person or through broadcast media.

2. A service performed in the course of the production of any digital, analog, or other recording of a moving or still image intended for public release or broadcast.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

2 440.62 (3) (ar) 2. Requires as a prerequisite to graduation completion of a
3 course of instruction in cosmetology of at least ~~1,800~~ 1,550 training hours in not less
4 than 10 months. The course of instruction may not exceed 8 training hours in any
5 one day for any student or 48 hours in any one week for any student.

10 **SECTION 3.** 454.02 (3) (bm) of the statutes is created to read:

11 454.02 (3) (bm) A service performed in the course of the production of any
12 digital, analog, or other recording of a moving or still image intended for public
13 release or broadcast, including through the Internet.

14 **SECTION 4.** 454.06 (2) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

15 454.06 (2) (b) Graduates from a course of instruction of at least ~~1,800~~ 1,550
16 training hours in not less than 10 months in a school of cosmetology licensed under
17 s. 440.62 (3) (ar) or exempted under s. 440.61 or has successfully completed an
18 apprenticeship under s. 454.10.

19 **SECTION 5.** 454.21 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

20 454.21 (3) (a) A service performed preparatory to a live public performance or
21 appearance, whether in-person or through broadcast media, including the Internet.

22 (b) A service performed in the course of the production of any digital or analog
23 recording of a moving or still image intended for public release or broadcast,
24 including through the Internet.
