What's the benefit to my salon?

Salons are choosing to participate in apprenticeship training because they want to formally train their stylists in their own facility, on their own equipment, with their own customers, to fit their own particular needs.

A representative from the State Bureau of Apprenticeship Standards must conduct an on-site inspection of the salon to ensure compliance before the salon can be deemed qualified to hire an apprentice.

The Bureau of Apprenticeship Standards reserves the right to deny apprentices to a salon with serious licensing violations or other evidence of inadequate levels of health, safety and overall program quality.

The barber/cosmetology apprenticeship program is a two year, 4000 hour training strategy that combines supervised, structured on-the job training with related instruction sponsored by Qualified Licensed Salons that have the ability to hire and train in a working environment.

The salon employs and trains the apprentice in all aspect of the profession. Related instruction is theoretical and technical, and it is usually provided by the Wisconsin Technical College System or a training center. The apprentice is paid by the sponsoring salon for the time attending class. The salon makes a commitment to hire and train the apprentice for this time period.


The apprentice makes a commitment to work in the salon and learn the profession. At the end of the training, the apprentice is eligible to take the Department of Regulation and Licensing (DRL) exam to become a licensed barber/cosmetology practitioner.

HOW TO BECOME QUALIFIED TO REGISTER AN APPRENTICE

1. Have an Active Unemployment Account. (Not the same as Workers Compensation.)
2. Be in business as a licensed salon at least one year.
3. Be able to employ an Apprentice full time. (at least 32 hours a week).
4. Have all the licenses required by Dept. of Regulation and Licensing (DRL).
5. Have necessary facilities per BC 3.01.
6. Meet all DRL sanitation requirements.
7. Employ sufficient licensed staff – A licensed manager or qualified practitioner is required to supervise the apprentice at all times.
8. Provide all necessary tools, equipment and supplies. Apprentice must have a designated work station.
9. Perform full range of services or have a training plan for all processes.

How do I sign up?

1. Make sure your salon meets the minimum qualifications.
2. Contact your local Apprenticeship Training Representative (ATR) to obtain an application form.
3. Complete the application form and send it to the ATR along with the permit fee.
4. Develop your barber/cosmetology apprenticeship program standards with the assistance of your ATR.
5. Register your apprentice. The ATR will meet with the designated salon manager and apprentice on site at the salon to review and finalize the apprentice contract. Once approved, DRL will issue the apprentice permit and the apprentice will be assigned to an apprenticeship class.
6. The apprentice starts to work and you begin training! Remember, the apprentice may not begin practicing in the salon until the apprentice contract has been approved!
