RGL recently learned that it was not successful in its bid to retain the foregoing Proctor & Gamble In-plant business, meaning that RGL will not be able to continue to employ all of the individuals it currently has employed at the Subject Employment Site. Our customer is retaining another third-party logistics company to do this work inside their facility for them.

The foregoing action is expected to result in the permanent elimination of up to 70 forklift operator hourly employees within RGL Specialty Solutions in Green Bay, WI, and particularly at the Subject Employment Site. We do not expect that any other job classification will be adversely impacted by this particular lay off.

RGL expects to begin eliminating positions no earlier than April 26, 2023; however, timing is strictly dependent on the customer's startup with the new 3PL provider.
