## **DVR Waiting List** (Order of Selection)

If you are put on the waiting list for DVR services, called Order of Selection, then we will contact you when you can receive services. While you are waiting for DVR services, other agencies may be able to help you. Please contact DVR if you want to be referred to those agencies.

## The DVR waiting list has three categories:

- Category 1 Most Significant Disabilities
- Category 2 Significant Disabilities
- Category 3 All Other Eligible Individuals

## DVR serves people with the most significant disabilities (Category 1) first.

Your waiting list category is based on how your disability affects your ability to function in certain areas. DVR looks at seven areas to determine your waiting list category:

- Mobility
- Communication
- Self-care
- Self-direction
- Interpersonal skills
- Work tolerance
- Work skills



If you are put on the DVR waiting list, DVR will invite you off of the waiting list based on your waiting list category and the date you applied for DVR.

If you receive Social Security Disability benefits (SSI and/or SSDI), you are automatically placed in at least Category 2. DVR can decide if you should be moved to Category 1 after talking with you.
