- Strategy: (1) education/outreach, (2) admin. enforcement, and (3) criminal prosecution
- Share data → Enhance enforcement of tax, labor, and licensing laws
- Site inspections
- Target industries known for noncompliance: construction, nail salon, restaurant, massage parlor, bar/nightclub, and automotive
- Fact sheet, brochure, and booklet
- Annual reports: <u>2019</u>, <u>2018</u>, and <u>2017</u>
